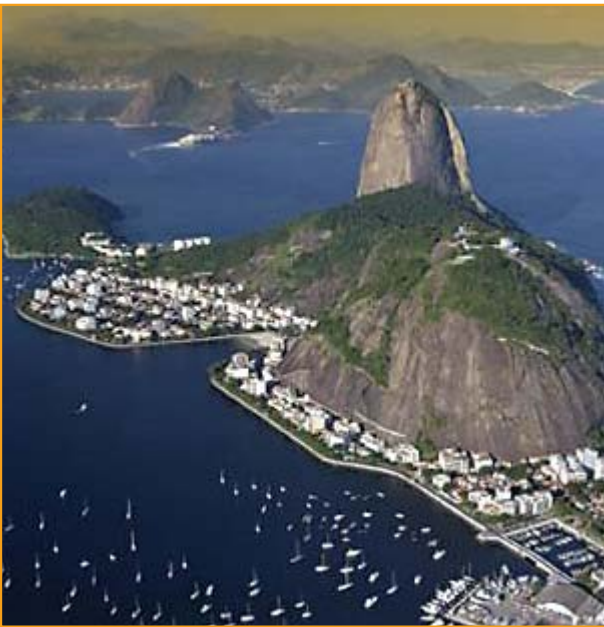

Barely a generation ago, Chile, Argentina and Brazil experienced militarized governments abusing the power of Law to wage state terror against defenseless populations clamoring for self determination. In the meantime, Puerto Rico has remained a colonized island nation, denied the right of self determination while ruled from above by northern elites. Events in these and similar locales thus have sparked comparative questions among critical global thinkers everywhere: which overarching human rights lessons should activists, policymakers, lawyers and others draw from the global South ... what precautionary insights might they counsel to people now living under the lengthening shadows of new 'wars' ... shall the recent history of the South become the imminent fate of the North?

To help students develop their own views on these pressing kinds of questions, the Critical Global Classroom (CGC) offers a six-week study abroad program featuring an innovative curriculum and spearheaded by a diverse faculty representing each host country and the U.S. The CGC convenes in San Juan for the first three weeks, where all students are enrolled in introductory courses on comparative law, international law and critical theory. Turning to the application of this foundational knowledge, students then spend the second three weeks either in Chile and Argentina or in Brazil, based on their pre-enrollment choices. Designed to help empower students as agents of social change, the CGC is a rigorous, hands-on, cross-disciplinary adventure in critical global education that satisfies all requirements of the American Bar Association (ABA) and awards up to eight academic credits.

The CGC is the only study-abroad law program in the world organized around social justice activism and legal reform. The CGC also is the only study-abroad law program that integrates into its curriculum the LATCRIT COLLOQUIUM ON INTERNATIONAL AND COMPARATIVE LAW. The CGC academic calendar also begins on June 25 and ends on August 5 to help students "split" their summers and make the most of their time. All CGC academic activities are conducted conveniently on-site at well-located and comfortable hotels or nearby universities, all instruction is in English, and all course materials are provided in advance. Just as important, the total cost of program fees to spend six weeks abroad is about the same as, or even less than, the per-credit on-campus tuition at most or many U.S. law schools. In design and substance, the CGC aims to provide a high-value and cost-effective opportunity to study law, policy and social justice activism among likeminded faculty and peers. But program logistics limit enrollment; apply early and reserve your place NOW in this unique experience studying abroad!
