(NB: The paper should be organized as appropriate to the material *not* necessarily according to the three areas listed here.)

*In-class presentation on research paper* (15-20 min) – 20% of grade; presented in April. Should cover items (a)-(c) described above.

**Papers:** Papers should be *double-sppaced*, with a *reasonable-sized font* (eg, 12), and *reasonable margins*. Additionally, papers should comply with the attached "Writing Guidelines" sheet.
