9 Day Itinerary

Day 1 Saturday, April 27 Arrive Havana City!

2-5:00 pm Arrive in Havana, check-in to Hotel Nacional de Cuba.

5-6:30 pm Orientation and familiarization. Welcome by Frank Valdes & Laura Gomez;

group introductions & discussion of research agendas relating to Cuba and/or the Americas.

6:30-7:30 Opportunity to explore the Plaza around Santa Angel restaurant before dinner.

7:30 pm Dinner at Santo Angel Restaurant (traditional Cuban cuisine): enjoy fresh lobster-on-skewers served in a great courtyard ambiance with traditional Cuban

music; great opportunity to leisurely explore the Plaza around Santo Angel afterward.

Day 2 Sunday, April 28

7:00 am Buffet Breakfast at the hotel

8–9:30 am Lecture by Laura Gómez, "Introduction to the Cuban Legal System," followed by open group discussion in the Conference Room of the Hotel Nacional.

10-10:30 am Visit to the Old Havana Model (Lecture by Isabel Rigol, followed by walking tour).

10:30-12 pm Visit Old Havana Four Plazas: After a short lecture at the Model, visit Old Havana on foot, walking between the four main plazas that comprise Cuba's first

UNESCO World Heritage Site. Start at Plaza de Armas, the site of the oldest Spanish fortress in the Americas, the 1519 locale of the first mass in Cuba, and the massive Baroque seat of government, known as Palacio de los Capitanes Generales. Continue to Plaza de San Francisco de Assis and Plaza Vieja. Wind

through historic streets spanning 5 centuries of historic architecture and end at Plaza de la Catedral and see the Baroque cathedral.

12:00 pm Ernest Hemingway's Room at Ambos Mundos Hotel: Located on the 5th floor of Ambos Mundo Hotel in Old Havana, visit the room where Hemingway spent 7

years and wrote "For Whom The Bells Toll." Also see many of his personal belongings, including his typewriter.

12:45 pm Lunch and group discussion at Hotel Florida. Housed in a magnificent colonial-style hotel of the XIX century, the Hotel Florida is one of a series of hotels

developed by the Historian of the City of Havana. Lunch will be served in their colonial patio restaurant, which features fine Criollo food. Afternoon is open

for informal meetings or visits on your own to places of interest.

7:00 pm Social hour at the Hotel Nacional's Bar of Fame (optional)

8:30 pm Dinner on your own at La Guarida (location for the film, Fresa y Chocolate).

Day 3 April 29

7:00 am Buffet breakfast at the hotel

9am-12 pm First meeting with the Cuban Society of Constitutional and Administrative law of the National Association of Lawyers of Cuba. Theme:

Cuban Legal and State System. Subjects: The Constitution of the Republic; The Judicial System Structure and Functions. Meeting at the National

Association of Lawyers.

12:30 pm Lunch and group discussion at El Aljibe Restaurant (Criollo/Cuban cuisine), an outdoor thatched roof restaurant located a few minutes from

downtown Havana in the residential area of Miramar. With a flavor created by the family since the first restaurant was founded on the El Aljibe farm,

the specialty combines roast chicken with French fries and fried plantain, delicious black beans, white rice, salad and national sweets.

Afternoon is open for informal meetings or visits on your own to places of interest (i.e. farmers market.)

7:30 pm Dinner on your own; we will recommend a restaurant (i.e. Vista al Mar).

9:30 am Visit to a Bufete colectivo (law firm): Tour, lecture and discussion at a regular bufete (firm) in Havana to learn about everyday legal practice,

especially cases related to family law, criminal law, and property law.

1:00 pm Lunch and group discussion at La Barraca Restaurant. Set in the gardens of the Hotel Nacional, this traditional ranchón-style restaurant serves

typical Cuban food. Afternoon is open for informal meetings, or visiting places of interest on your own.

7:30 pm Dinner at Armadores de Santander Restaurant for a tantalizina Criolla meal at this magnificant terrace with a panoramic view of the bay.

Day 5 Wednesday, May 1

10:00 am Visit Guanabacoa Museum (Popular religious traditions in Cuba): comprised of objects of the popular Cuban religions of African origins: Regla

de Osha, Reglas Congas and the Abakuá Secret Religious Societies.

11:30 am Ernest Hemingway's Finca La Vigia (Hemingway Farm and Museum): Visit Ernest Hemmingway's Finca La Vigia, located on a hilltop in the rural

village of San Francisco de Paula, just southeast of the City of Havana. The home has recently been the subject of a massive preservation effort by the National Trust for Historic Preservation as the author left it in 1961. At this farm you will see his sport-fishing boat, the Pilar. The Finca Vigia

estate and the fishing village of Cojimar are considered the most significant locales for those interested in Hemmingway's history.

1:15 pm Lunch at an artist house at La Cabana.

3:00 pm Second meeting with the Cuban Society of Constitutional and Administrative Law of the National Association of Lawyers of Cuba. Theme: Economy

and Society. Subjects: New Economic Guidelines; New laws and economic social and cultural changes in Cuba; Analysis of the self-employment sectors.

Reception and presentation of program certificates at National Association of Lawyers of Cuba.

7:30 pm Dinner on your own; we will recommend a restaurant or paladar (i.e Cafe Laurent).
